ROBERT REEDY BRYAN SOCIETY AWARD



The R.R. Bryan Society honors retired faculty, staff and others whose dedicated, selfless service to Carson-Newman University is exceptional, inspirational and meritorious.

Named for Robert Reedy Bryan, who in 1849 joined four other men under an oak tree to discuss the need for a Baptist college in East Tennessee. Their collective vision forever etched them into Carson-Newman lore as "The Oak Tree Five." Bryan served as primary professor of what began as Mossy Creek Missionary Baptist Seminary at one point teaching the entire curriculum. He also served as the second and sixth president, filling the role after the sudden death of one leader and again after the devastation of the Civil War.

It is with great pleasure the University welcomes these inaugural inductees into the R.R. Bryan Society, each exemplifying extraordinary love and devotion to Carson-Newman.

VICKIE BUTLER

Vickie Butler joined C-N's development office in 1989 as the alumni director, becoming the first woman to serve in the area. Throughout the course of 28 years, Butler, a 1976 graduate of Carson-Newman, answered the call each time her alma mater looked to her for leadership. She served in roles, such as: Director of Development, Associate Vice President for Advancement, Vice President, and Executive Director for Alumni Relations. A co-founder of Women of Vision with former First Lady, Kay O'Brien, Vickie's gift of connecting with constituents brought her both joy and lasting relationships that continue to benefit the University even today. From Blye-Poteat Hall and Ted Russell Hall, to Greer House and The Chitwood Center at Hale Place, Butler's fingerprints and a piece of her heart are on many of the University's facilities from the relationships she fostered.



MARK HEINRICH

Dr. Mark Henrich joined C-N in 1980 as assistant in the counseling center and director of the career planning office. He served the University for the next 21 years in myriad capacities, all while rising through the faculty ranks from assistant professor on to full professorship. He became chair of his department, served as dean for the Social Sciences Division, interim vice president for Academic Affairs and associate provost. He also directed C-N's School Counseling program, chaired the Counselor Education program, and led the new student orientation process. When opportunities arose and visionary leadership wasneeded the University often looked to Mark for insight. Among his students, he was routinely praised for his attentiveness and ability to relate to each individual. Among his colleagues, he was commended for serving as a role model for fellow faculty members.



MARY PHIPPS

For more than a century Carson-Newman has felt like "home" to generations of students. Achieving such an atmosphere requires hard work. It takes a sense of community, efforts behind the scenes, and a love for helping students feel at peace while away from family. In her more than 40 years of service to Carson-Newman, Mary Phipps did just that. Following in her mother's footsteps, she joined C-N's housekeeping staff in 1953. For Mary, making students feel at home went beyond maintaining residence halls. She was a second mother to many, offering them advice and guidance, and even showing up at 4 a.m. to care for them when they were sick. She served her final 19 years at the President's Home developing a lasting friendship with Dr. and Mrs. Maddox. For many students during her time at C-N, Mary's service to C-N created that atmosphere of home away from home.



FRANK PINKERTON

After joining C-N's chemistry faculty in 1978 a common theme developed during his 33-year tenure at Mossy Creek – and it was demonstrated through those he taught. He wanted his students to be prepared. In addition to classroom instruction, for nine season he coached the Lady Eagles tennis team, compiling a .701 winning percentage. He encouraged academic success by even letting players skip a practice if they needed to attend a lab or study for an important exam. He later served as chair of C-N's Chemistry Department. His Health Professions students were renown for being equipped for medical schools and graduate programs. Though he had an undeniable positive impact on his students' lives, he is quick to credit his colleagues for their collaborative efforts and the support of University leadership in helping students prepare and succeed after graduating from Carson-Newman.



JOE BILL SLOAN

The son of Carson-Newman graduates, Joe Bill Sloan grew up three blocks from campus. His dad worked at the University for 40 years as both professor and administrator, so Mossy Creek was a backdrop to Sloan's childhood. Joe Bill joined the faculty ranks himself soon after graduating from Carson-Newman in 1967. While teaching in the History and Political Science Department, he also served as chair and later dean of the Social Sciences Division. His impact was immeasurable and remains the only person to receive the Outstanding Student Advisor Award twice. The University sought his leadership when it asked him to serve as associate provost and in 2007, he answered the call to stand at the helm of his alma mater when asked to serve as interim president. Like R.R. Bryan he served ably before returning to what he loved most – the classroom and teaching his students.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Cap and Gown

Faculty and students participate in a long-standing tradition of wearing academic regalia at commencement. Dating back to the 12th and 13th centuries, the clothing of the scholar was the dress of the cleric. Universities today are generally regarded as formal institutions of learning that have their origins in Medieval Christian tradition. Today, these garments reflect the educational achievement of the wearer as well as the colors of their discipline and school of study.

Observers will note the differences in sleeves and embellishment of the gowns. The baccalaureate gown worn by graduating seniors tends to be simple in design. Atop the square mortar board, the undergraduates wear a tassel to their right which is moved upon the completion of the ceremony. Though the cap and gown are modest, baccalaureate candidates may also wear honor cords, stoles, and medals representative of academic or other significant achievement during their undergraduate career.

Gowns for students graduating with master's and doctoral degrees tend to have more ornate construction. Instead of a square mortar board, graduate tams (caps) can be a variety of designs made of the same material as the gown or velvet. The accompanying tassel is worn to the left (the wearer already possessing a bachelor's degree) and in some cases stationary. Additionally, the master's and doctoral gowns differ from the baccalaureate gown with the inclusion of a hood. However, the doctoral hood differs from the master's hood in size being the larger of the two. The doctoral gowns have cuffed sleeves adorned with three velvet chevrons and additional velvet trim down either side the gown's opening. The color of the chevrons and trim reflect the discipline color (see chart below), and the inside of the hood contains the colors of the degree-granting institution. As recipients of the highest honors, doctoral faculty members refrain from wearing additional cords or medals (except the Presidential Medal or the Distinguished Faculty Award medal.)

Cords, Stoles, and Medals

Cords, stoles, and medals can be given in recognition of many different types of student achievement and extracurricular service while studying at Carson-Newman. For example, students recognized for high academic achievement are inducted into the Alpha Chi honor society and receive a gold-colored cord and gold lapel pin. Additionally, students who completed Carson-Newman's Honors Program receive a gold-colored stole. Students recognized for scholastic achievement, leadership, and service are inducted into the Mortar Board Society and receive a gold and white cord and medallion. The Ministry and Missions Cord is awarded to graduating seniors who have exemplified living a life of ministry or missions during their time at Carson-Newman University. As with the various colors associated with the academic disciplines on display with doctoral regalia, differing academic societies and student organizations present a variety of colored cords to signify student membership into these organizations.

Additional adornments such as pins and medals are given to students for a variety of recognition. Medallions awarded include the President's medal, the W.D. Hudgins Sr. Student Leadership medal, and recognized departmental Outstanding Majors.

Colors

Traditionally, the color for all gowns is black. However, degree-granting institutions may select unique colors for the gown and trim.

CEREMONIAL BANNERS AND MACE

Ceremonial Mace

The recipient of Carson-Newman University's Distinguished Faculty Award leads the procession of faculty and students while carrying the ceremonial mace. Historically, the mace was a blunt weapon of war made of wood or metal. The ceremonial mace is a symbol of authority and independence of the institution to convene a convocation or commencement ceremony. Additionally, it signifies the authority the institution bears to bestow upon the candidates for graduation the various degrees awarded.

Gonfalons

The banners carried and stationed on the stage bear witness to our unique mission as an institution of Christian higher education and represent the division among our various disciplines. School deans carry the banners representing the associated schools that govern the various degree programs leading to associate, baccalaureate, master's, or doctoral degrees.

Atop the three larger gonfalons sits a brass cross. The cross symbolizes the Lordship of Jesus Christ, who ushered in His kingdom through His death on the cross and subsequent resurrection. In Christ we find perfect expression and fulfillment of Truth, Beauty, and Goodness, our school motto. In the background of each banner, you see the rolling mountains of Appalachia, the region we serve, and the year of our beginning, 1851.
