Three courses of study—The CLASSICAL (Degree A. B.), the LATIN SCIENTIFIC (Degree B. S.), and the ENGLISH SCIENTIFIC (Certificate). Special studies for those who do not wish to confine themselves to a prescribed course. Special lectures on business, the laws of health, and social culture will be made prominent.

The utmost care will be taken to cultivate the finer feelings, and to develop the higher instincts of the students, while rigid discipline will be maintained.

The Carson College building will be thoroughly renovated and fitted for a young ladies' home. It will be kept by Prof. W. A. Cate, his wife acting as matron, and will accommodate about twenty-four boarders. Other young ladies will find board in the homes of Mrs. H. Brown, Prof. W. T. Russell, and others. No promiscuous boarding will be permitted.

Young ladies and gentlemen will meet at chapel and on recitation, and other association will be granted only when thought proper by the faculty.

Four literary societies, with commodious halls, in connection with the libraries and reading room, add much to the advantages of the college.

It is intended to open the next term in the new building, a small cut of which appears above. The expenses of a student, exclusive of music and art, need not exceed \$150 per year. When students room in the dormitories and furnish their own board, these figures can be reduced 40 per cent. Ministers, who may be worthy and indigent, receive their tuition, and most of their text-books free, and, when necessary are assisted in payment of their board. Children of ministers actively engaged in preaching or of deceased ministers, are charged only half tuition.
