

F-I-T INSTRUCTIONS

Writing about reading assignments will help you understand, reflect on, and analyze them. Each F-I-T consists of three discrete parts: an interesting or unusual fact that you observed during your reading, an interpretation of a certain part or of the whole that can be made, and a tie-in to your own experience, perhaps involving another course you have studied, another work of literature, or even a current event (see the F-I-T format and sample F-I-T). Do not use outside sources for these unless instructed to do so. Your professor is interested in your thoughts about these works, not someone else's. Use MLA internal documentation style for quotes and paraphrases from the work itself.
