☐ **Foreign Language Requirement for B.A. Degrees Only, 6 hours (2 courses) Spanish, German, French, Greek, Hebrew, or ASL (American Sign Language)**

6 hours at the 100- or 200-level to be determined by each B.A. Degree Department. It is not required for the B.S., B.M., and B.S.N. degrees unless specifically required by the degree department. Students who have taken Language in high school must take a placement exam (on-Line)/CN website/\$10) to determine the appropriate course. If placement score is low, additional coursework may be required. The psychology department allows 3 hours each of two different languages.
